
Mission Moment


Missionaries to Ethiopia serve God's people by teaching men at the local seminaries, preparing them to become pastors and teachers of God's Word.

Injera (Ethiopian Bread)


Yield: 5 servings

Ingredients:

- 2 cups self-rising flour
- 2 cups seltzer water or club soda
- ½ teaspoon baking soda

Directions:

- Mix ingredients in a large bowl.
- Mix until consistency is like pancake batter.
- Heat large skillet over medium high heat.
- Add small amount of cooking spray.
- Pour a thin layer of mixture into the pan.
- Cook until spongy and cooked through.



Devotion and Prayers



Read Acts 8:26-39.

Have you ever been lost or unable to find your parents? Feeling lost is scary. Did you know that you were once spiritually lost, separated from God? When Adam and Eve first sinned, they broke the relationship they had with God. Because we are children of Adam, we inherit this sin, which made us enemies of God. In sin, we are lost!

But God is merciful. Through His grace, He sent His Son, Jesus, to find lost sinners, like you and me. Jesus lived a sinless life, suffered and died in our place, and rose again in victory. Through Jesus, our broken relationship with God is restored. We are the children of God again because of Jesus and by the work of the Holy Spirit through Baptism. As children of God, we can boldly pray, "Our Father who art in heaven."

Finally, because we are now children of God, we have inherited eternal life with Jesus. We live today in confidence and joy in the hope of that eternal life.

Our Father, we thank You for the food, clothing, homes, and family members who care for us. Thank You for the missionaries in Ethiopia who teach the people about Jesus, the bread of life. In Your Son's name we pray. Amen.
