Aguonu Sausainiukai (Lithuanian Poppy Seed Cookies)

Yield: 2 dozen

Ingredients:

- 12¹/₂ ounces poppy seed filling
- 3 large eggs, beaten
- 2 tablespoons sour cream
- 2 tablespoons butter, melted and cooled
- ½ teaspoon baking soda
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- Pinch salt
- 1 cup all-purpose flour
- Confectioners' sugar

Directions:

- In a large bowl, combine poppy seed filling and eggs. Add all remaining ingredients except confectioners' sugar, mixing thoroughly.
- Heat oven to 350°F. Scoop cookie dough onto parchment-lined baking sheets.
- Bake until cookies are golden brown, 20–25 minutes.
- Cool cookies on pan. Dust with confectioners' sugar. Store in an airtight container.



Lithuanian Juosta (sash)

Materials:

- 2 × 6-inch strips of white cotton fabric
- Markers: red, green, purple, and black
- Sample patterns of Lithuanian weaving
- Velcro with adhesive back

Instructions:

- 1. Instead of weaving, draw patterns similar to the Lithuanian patterns provided.
- 2. Use red, green, purple, or black markers for the pattern. Also consider adding Christian symbols and patterns that mean something to you.
- When ink is dry, tie on your wrist or use Velcro to fasten. Tell the story of your colors and symbols.

Devotion and Prayers



Read John 6:1-14, 35-40.

Have you ever been at school or away from home and have just been so hungry you thought, "I could eat a horse"? That is a big, big hunger. In the Bible story, the crowd following Jesus had a big, big hunger and not much chance of getting food. Jesus had compassion on the hungry crowd and performed a great miracle. Jesus blessed five barley loaves and two fish and with these few items fed thousands of people. How did He do this? He did this through divine power because Jesus is God.

Jesus' concern for the people gathered was about more than their physical hunger. Jesus had great compassion for their spiritual hunger; He cares for our spiritual hunger too. Sin and Satan robbed us of spiritual nourishment. So much so that without Jesus we are spiritually dead. But Jesus says, "I am the bread of life." By believing in Jesus, we are made alive and our spiritual hunger is satisfied. Through the Holy Spirit, we are given faith to believe in Jesus, just like Jesus gave barley loaves and fish to the hungry.
